across the state, the Indiana SBDC delivers free expert-led guidance and resources ranging from business planning and market research to export assistance and company valuation, supporting small business owners through all stages of growth. In 2018, the Indiana SBDC celebrated a record-breaking year, assisting in 318 new business starts, nearly \$98 million of capital infusion, and in the creation of 1,265 new Hoosier jobs.

New Conference opportunity for manufacturing connections



[MADE IN AMERICA 2019](#), the first-ever exposition and celebratory event solely focusing on U.S. manufacturing and products made in the USA, will take place at the Indiana Convention Center in Indianapolis, October 3-6, 2019. With more than 800 exhibitors and 10,000 attendees expected, this four-day event will bring together the largest-ever network of industrial professionals, keynote speakers and

conscious consumers for one common goal: raising awareness for the economic, environmental and community impact of American manufacturing.

Purdue University is offering two courses in food safety



Purdue University will host two multi-day courses for food safety professionals that address preventative controls and requirements for food importers, while

also learning more about the Food Safety Modernization Act ([FSMA](#)). The first course, Preventive Control Qualified Individuals, will be 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. on May 20 and 21 and 8 a.m. to noon on May 22, and the second course, Foreign Supplier Verification Program, will be 1-5 p.m. May 22 and 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. on May 23. Both courses will take place at the Nelson Hall of Food Science, 745 Agricultural Mall Drive, West Lafayette. The courses will be led by [Yaohua Feng](#), Purdue assistant professor of [food science](#). Cost for the Preventive Control Qualified Individuals program is \$750, and the Foreign Supplier Verification Program course is \$500. Both courses can be attended for \$1,100.
